Stuff That Happens Before the Play:

- An evil witch, Sycorax, is banished to a remote island. While there, she gives birth to a son, Caliban.
- Sycorax enslaves a spirit of the island named Ariel, then imprisons him in an oak for disobedience. She dies without setting him free.
- Twelve years later: Prospero, the Duke of Milan, delights so in his studies that he entrusts care of the realm to his brother, Anthonio.
- Antonio forms an alliance with the King of Naples. Together, they plan to get rid of Prospero and set Antonio in his place as Duke.
- One dark night, aided by Antonio, men from Naples capture Prospero and his baby daughter Miranda and put them out to sea in a rickety old boat. A kind Neopolitan, Gonzalo, provides them with food, clothes, and many of Prospero's precious books.
- Propsero and Miranda land on the island lately inhabited by Sycorax.

 Using his art, Prospero frees Ariel and takes the spirit into his service.

 He fails to tame the wild Caliban and instead enslaves him.

Stuff That Happens In the Play:

- 12 years later: Alonzo, the King of Naples along with his son Ferdinand, Prospero's brother Antonio (now Duke of Milan), the noble Gonzalo, and other lords and servants, sets out for home after marrying his daughter to the prince of Tunis.
- Prospero learns of the voyage and sends Ariel to raise a tempest that will drive the vessel and its occupants to the island.
- Miranda, witnessing the ship's distress, pleads with her father for the lives of those on board. He replies by finally revealing to her the circumstances that brought them to the island and his identity as Duke of Milan.
- Prospero summons Ariel to give an account of the tempest. Ariel asks for his freedom, and Prospero - after chastising him - promises to free him in two days if he completes a few final tasks.
- Prospero summons Caliban, who rails against his slavery, saying he ruled the island before Prospero came. However, Prospero's art is so strong that Caliban must continue to obey him.
- Per Prospero's instruction, Ariel disperses the shipwreck victims in groups around the island. Each group thinks they are the only survivors.

Stuff That Happens In the Play, cont .:

- Ariel leads the King's son Ferdinand to Miranda, and the two quickly fall in love. Prospero planned for this, but pretends to be opposed in order to test and strengthen their devotion.
- Alonzo mourns the loss of his son, believing him to have perished in the storm. He and his lords fall asleep. Anthonio plots with the King's brother Sebastian to kill the King and put Sebastian on the throne of Naples, but they are prevented by Ariel, who wakes the King and his men. They set off to search for Ferdinand.
- Caliban encounters the King's butler Stephano and jester Trinculo. The pair introduce Caliban to wine, and he in turn worships Stephano. Caliban urges Stephano to kill Prospero and set himself up as King of the island, taking Miranda as his gueen.
- Miranda visits Ferdinand in secret and the two declare their love, watched secretly by Prospero.
- Prospero reveals himself and gives his blessing, with the proviso that they keep chaste until they are married.
- Prospero stages entertainment for the lovers to pass the time while all his plans come together.
- A mystical collision of goddesses, fools, lovers, traitors, and old friends ensues, resulting in events most wondrous strange.
